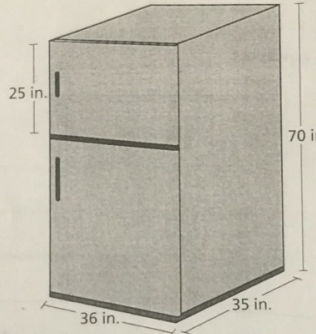

Answer: To find volume multiply base times width times height.

The dimensions of the fridge is $36 \times 35 \times 70$.

Multiply 36×35 to get 1260.

Multiply 1260×70 to get 88200.

The volume of the fridge is: 88,200 cubic inches.
